## **TOOLS**

#### **Position**

Your mobile phone has a GPS unit (Global Positioning System) to support the emergency function. This feature allows to locate the mobile phone worldwide, and to determine your exact location.

Note: The enabled position determination requires a lot of electricity, thereby reducing the operating time of mobile phone in continuous operation to 36 hours.

Note: The GPS functionality is inside buildings can not be guaranteed. If after a few minutes, you still have no position, check if you have a direct view to the sky (satellites), and/or go away from high walls of buildings.

Note: Rescue organizations will receive the positioning GPS coordinates. Recipients will receive a private google maps link. Note: If your device is not able to receive a GPS signal, the last saved position will be automatically sent with an appropriate notice.

- Enable/Disable positioning: enter menu Tools ⇒ enter Position with OK ⇒ Position on/off
- Share your position with friends:

Selected contacts have the opportunity to your current position interrogate another mobile phone.

These contacts are defined in your *Friends list*.

Do not worry: numbers that are not on this list can not

Do not worry: numbers that are not on this list can not determine your position.

Go to **Tools** ⇒ **Position** ⇒ **Show friend list** to see which of your contacts is it allowed to check your position.

Note: To enter, delete or edit the Friends list please contact your service provider.

#### **Bluetooth**

- Enable/Disable Bluetooth: enter menu Tools ⇒ enter Bluetooth with OK ⇒ Bluetooth on/off
- Pairing devices: enter menu Tools ⇒ enter Bluetooth with OK ⇒ Connections OK ⇒ Search for new devices OK to search for available devices ⇒ choose the desired device ⇒ confirm with OK.

  Paired devices are automatically recognized the next time, if they are in range.

# <u>Alarm</u>

Press (☼) in standby mode ⇒

■ *New time*: enable alarm clock ⇒ enter time ⇒ confirm with OK.

The alarm clock rings every day at this time.

■ *Off*: disable alarm clock

Press OK to stop an ringing alarm.

Mute an ringing alam by pressing (rings again in a minute).

# **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

# The mobile phone is not responding:

Remove battery, re-insert and switch on the device.

If still no response, please contact the Service Center.

#### The charging process will not start:

It may take a few minutes. If no response after 10 minutes, please contact the Service Center.

## **EMPORIA EMERGENCY BUTTON**

You can store up to 5 emergency numbers (family, neighbours, friends, emergency services).

• In case of an emergency press the emergency button on the reverse side of the mobile telephone either for 3 seconds or 3 times within 3 seconds. The emergency key will still work when the key lock is enabled.

By pressing the emergency button the emergency sequence is started. Up to 5 numbers will be called in a predetermined order until someone answers the emergency call. This process is repeated 3 times.

- If no emergency number is defined, your prepaid-card is out of charge or you are outside of the home network of your network operator, the international emergency number 112 will be called.
- During the emergency sequence a warning tone is played back, to inform the people around you about the emergency.

PleaseNote: By answering the emergency call, the called person have to dial the  $\bigcirc$  3 times, during the first minute of the call. (Dialing the  $3x\bigcirc$  by the receiver of the call ensures that your emergency call is not forwarded to an answering machine or voicemail).

Parallel to the emergency calls in the background, your position is determined. If this information is available, a text message will be sent to all emergency numbers, including your current location or address (Google-Maps-Link). Through the use of network services (emergency SMS) may incur charges.

### Saving emergency numbers:

Go to **Phone book** ⇒ **Emergency numbers** ⇒ **Add Emerg. No** ⇒ choose **EmNo.** (1-5) ⇒ specify whether it is a **Private number** or a **Helporganisation** ⇒ choose a contact in **Phone book** ⇒ finished

PleaseNote: If you choose **Private number** the receiver have to dial  $3x \bigcirc$ . By a **Helporganisation**, a recall is not required. **Enable the emergency button**:

Go to Phone book ⇒ Emergency numbers ⇒ Emergency button ⇒ On/Off



## **INSERTING THE SIM CARD**








<u>Fig. 1a+b</u>: Remove the battery cover **Fig. 2**: Insert the SIM card with the gold chip down

- battery is fully charged: bars in the battery icon stop moving



## **FIRST STEPS**

Press and hold the -key for 2 seconds to switch on the phone. To turn off, press and hold 2 seconds again. When using a new SIM card, enter the 4 digit PIN Code (Personal Identification Number) and confirm with OK. Note: The PIN-Code is a 4-digit number combination preventing others from switching on your mobile phone.

# Incoming call:

- Pick up: press the OK-key
- Reject: press the —-key
- Muting the ringer temporarily: press the —-key

# **End a call**: press the -key Dialing:

Enter the phone number with the keypad (including area code with 0)  $\Rightarrow$  start call with  $\bigcirc K$ .

## Redaillist:

Enter the **Redaillist** by press the OK-key. ⇒ Select a number with or from a redaillist (Missed calls, Dialled numbers or Received calls). ⇒ Start the call with OK.

## Handsfree:

Press -key during a call, to enable or disable the handsfree function.

#### Standby mode:

In standby mode the phone is turned on, but no active applications (calling, messaging, ...) are running.

- Press the OK-key or A-key to select the shown (above the keys) option.
- After a few seconds without input, the display is switched off to save power. By an incoming call or pressing any key, the screen turns on again automatically.
- To return to the standby screen, press the key repeatedly or press and hold the -key until the standby screen appears.
- If you select a menu item, without confirming with OK, an information text about this menu item is shown afte a while automatically. To hide the text, press the button.

Enter the menu: press the -key Chose/confirm: with OK

Enter menu with  $\Rightarrow$  enter **Settings** with  $\land$ ,  $\land$ ,  $\bigcirc$ Security settings:

Edit the PIN code or to Activate/Deactivate the PIN code query or the **Phonecode** (default: 1234).

## **PHONEBOOK**

Save names and numbers (always includ the area code, e.g. +44 for UK)

No., Change sequence, Delete Emerg. No., Emergency button on/off), Copy contact, Top 5, Edit contact, Delete contact, Send contact by SMS, SMS in PhoneBk, Mailbox number, PhoneBk settings.

## Save a contact (name & number):

Enter menu with  $\square \Rightarrow$  enter **Phone book** with  $\bigvee$ ,  $\bigcirc K \Rightarrow$ choose *Add contact* with  $\bigvee$ ,  $\bigcirc$ K  $\Rightarrow$  enter number  $\Rightarrow$ enter name with the keypad (See SMS-chapter for writing text)  $\Rightarrow \nabla \Rightarrow$  save with  $\bigcirc \kappa$ .

# Search a Phone book entry:

Enter the **Phone book** by pressing ✓ in standby mode ⇒

- Scroll through the entries with  $\bigvee$  and  $\bigwedge$ .  $\Rightarrow$  Or...
- use **Search name**: enter the initial letters of the searched name (may continue to scroll with  $\boxed{\lor}$ ).  $\Rightarrow$

When the requested name is shown, press or to start call. Accessing the Phone book via SMS:

In the **Phone book** menu ⇒ enable **SMS in PhoneBk**, to receive phonebook entries by SMS message. Specify that only stored contacts may send phone book entries (Only from PhoneBk) to you.

The phone number is automatically saved in your phone book, if the messages is written in the following format: #Name#Nummer#, e.g.: #Martin#+436641234567#

## **SMS MESSAGE**

**SMS (Short Message Service)** is a short text messages, including a max. of 160 signs. Costs are only incurred during shipping, but not at the reception.

**Writing text**: Enter menu with 🗎 ⇒

enter **SMS Message** with OK ⇒ choose **New SMS** with OK. Entering text with the keypad. Every key represents several signs, depending on how often you press the key. (e.g. 2x 4), 1x 2), 3x 5), 3x 6) for *hallo*)

**Sending SMS**: After typing the text, press 2x OK **Send**. Enter the number or choose from phonebook (OK), scroll to the contact and select with OK). Press OK again to send the message.

**Receiving an SMS**: A short signal and an display-promp inform you about a new, incoming SMS message. Whit ox you ou can read the message now or enter the menu **SMS Message** ⇒ **Received SMS** to acess the list of receiveed messages.
